## Chapeles and Churches

### Church St. Nikolaus in Tannheim

The parish church in Tannheim, once the religious focus for the entire Tannheimer Tal, is the second largest church of the Diocese of Innsbruck next to Neustift in the Stubai Tal. It was built in Baroque style from 1722 to 1724. The builder was Andreas Hafenegger from Haldensee. A complete renovation of the church took place from 1989 to 1996. Additionally, the Tannheim parish church also has a historically significant set of church bells by the famous Tyrolean bronze-casting family, Löffler, which incidentally, is the only completely preserved one in Tyrol.

### Church Mariä Himmelfahrt (Assumption of Mary) in Nesselwängle

The first late Gothic church above the village on the "Lahn" was destroyed in the early 18th century by an avalanche. The church which followed, located on the present site and built between 1728 and 1732, was badly damaged by fire in 1882. It was rebuilt and consecrated in 1885. The tower with the chamfered corners on the top story was covered with an original-style roof in the late 19th century. The most recent church renovation was completed in 1992.

### Church St. Wendelin in Grän

The St. Wendelin church with its onion-shaped bell tower, is located in the center of Grän. Grän had been an "Expositur" ("outpost") of the Tannheim church since 1794, and was named an independent parish in 1980. The shepards and cattlemen worshipped the patron St. Wendelin, and this led to the construction of a small chapel here already in the 15th century. In 1617, the chapel was demolished and replaced by a new building. The present building was completed in 1789 under the supervision of the local builder, Michael Zobl, and was inaugurated in 1793. Stylistically, the interior already displays significant elements of Classicism. It has a quadruple-bay great hall with a starkly protruding cornice on doric pilasters, which also encircles the choir stall. The renovation took place from 1986 to 1992.

### Expositur Church St. Joseph in Zöblen

Zöblen with the hamlets of Katzensteig, Oberhalde and Unterhalde has had a "branch" church since 1794 and is today under the stewardship of Schattwald. St. Joseph's church was built in 1785 and consecrated in 1793, and replaced the chapel built here in 1682. After a fire in 1932, the church was restored and refurbished late 19th century. It was last renovated in 1989. The interior has a hall with rounded-off corners on the choir arch wall, with a barrel vault ceiling above an encircling cornice; the East side displays a retracted choir room with rounded ends, and the West side has a double gallery.

### Church St. Wolfgang in Schattwald

Schattwald with the hamlets of Fricken, Wies, Kappl, Steig, Rehbach and Vilsrain had been pastorally cared for by the clergy from Nesselwängle since 1506. In 1699, it became a "Kaplanei"



with its own chaplain, in 1787 an "Expositur" (branch), and in 1948 an independent parish. In 1835, the church tower was raised, in 1863 a restoration took place, and in the following year, the newly renovated church was consecrated. Today's existent church is a completely new building dating to 1893. The ceiling frescoes in the choir show the patron as protector of the parish church and the village.

### **Parish Church Mariä Namen in Jungholz**

Built in the beginning of 1700 with a beautiful high altar, precious ceiling frescoes, and colorful church windows depicting saints.

### **Tannheim Valley Chapels**

*These all belong to the Tannheim parish:*

#### **Maria-Hilf Chapel (Our Lady of Perpetual Succour)**

The reason for its erection was the „black plague“, which raged in Tannheim in 1635. The chapel was built in 1649, and only in 1685 was it consecrated with its high altar. The chapel with its shingled onion-domed tower has a spacious interior and uniform altar furnishings from the period around 1680. The shrine-shaped high altar bears a statue of the Madonna with Child in its central niche.

#### **St. Martin in Innergschwend**

Between Grän and Tannheim, the small hamlet Innergschwend lies with its chapel consecrated in the name of the Holy Bishop Martin. Mentioned the first time in 1494, the original Gothic building was altered in a Baroque style in 1685/86. The consecration of the chapel took place in October of 1725 by the then Bishop of Augsburg. The Rocaille cartouche in Rococo style (around 1760) above the choir arch is decorated with the attributes of St. Martin.

#### **St. Sebastian in Berg**

The rather unassuming exterior of the Baroque St. Sebastian chapel in the hamlet of Berg, north of Tannheim, surprises visitors with beautiful stucco features on the interior. Built around 1653, the chapel was expanded and redesigned in 1757, and was most recently renovated in 1995.

#### **St. Leonhard in Kienzen (Plague Chapel)**

In 1635 the plague was imported into the Tannheimer Tal by soldiers. At least two-thirds of the population then fell victim to the epidemic. Built in the late Gothic period from 1488 to 1495, the inviting chapel stands in an open field between the hamlets of Kienzen and Untergschwend.

#### **Lourdes Chapel in the Grotto**

South of Tannheim, on a wooded hill, the idyllic Lourdes Chapel is a replica of the „Lourdes Grotto“ with the Madonna standing on a bubbling spring. Fourteen stations of the cross lead up to the chapel. It was built in neo-Gothic style on the occasion of the parish silver jubilee of pastor Anton Zoller in 1902 and decorated by the school inspector, Anton Peterlunger, with depictions from the Litany of Loreto.



#### **Dreifaltigkeit Chapel (Holy Trinity) in Kienzerle**

The construction of the chapel (1680-1700) has to do with the vow of two women who survived the plague. Flat-roofed prayer room with a round apse and riders, altarpiece depicting the Coronation of the Virgin (19th c.). Renovated in 1989.

#### **St. Michael in Kienzen**

The small chapel devoted to St. Michael at the edge of Kienzen harbours a small altar erected around 1680 with a statue of St. Michael, and in the upper part of the altar, God, the Father.

#### **Herz-Jesu Chapel on the Hill (Sacred Heart)**

For the 200th anniversary of the vow of the Sacred Heart, Bernadette Müller had a chapel erected in the meadows of Berg with a statue in it. On the chapel wall the inscription reads: „Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us, 1796 - 1996“.

*These all belong to the Grän parish:*

#### **Michael's Chapel in Lumberg**

Verifiably traced back to 1695, it must have existed much earlier. Features: Rocaille beaded stucco from ca. 1760. Altar from the 2nd half of the 17th century, with the image of Archangel Michael painted by Rudolf Rief of Tannheim in 1946.

#### **St. Jakob Chapel in Haldensee**

The chapel of St. Jakob the Younger in Haldensee, the birthplace of architect Andreas Hafenegger, first documented in 1695, was perhaps built under his supervision.

*These all belong to the Nesselwängle parish:*

#### **Antonius Chapel**

The St. Antonius chapel, which is part of the „Sunneschlössli“ Hotel, was consecrated in 1997. It has a wine cellar in its cryptic basement.

### **Dreifaltigkeit Chapel (Holy Trinity) in Rauth**

Built in 1726 by the property owners. Rectangular-shaped praying room with a 3/8th end, ribboned stucco on choir archway.



### **Maria-Hilf Chapel (Our Lady of Perpetual Succour)**

Located at the fork in the road on the way to Rauth, this chapel was restored after the war by Josef Bilgeri. Prayer room with bell riders, a painting of Madonna and Child by Melchior Paul von Deschwanden, 1874.

### **St. John the Baptist in Haller**

Right on the street it was built in 1736/37. High altar from 1641 sponsored by the inhabitants of the small hamlet of Haller, painting of Maria with Child and John of Nepomuk and St. John the Baptist.

### **Rainbow Chapel**

On the way to the hamlet of Rauth, it is owned by the Perle family. Praying room with barrel vaulting, triangular choir room with a very valuable Baroque crucifix.

### **Stanze Chapel near Rauth**

An open chapel on the way to the Birkental valley. Small Baroque altar with a statue of Magnus. Privately owned by the Erdle family.

### **Kreuzkapelle (Cross Chapel) at the Gaicht Pass**

The chapel from the time of the Plague, formerly stood alongside the Gaicht Pass Road, it was rebuilt on a more visible location above the road by the local community in 1990.

### **Visitation of Mary Chapel in Gaicht**

It was built by the locals from Gaicht in 1695 at the sight of the previous Gothic chapel.

### **Dreikreuzkapelle (Three Crosses) in Schmitte**

At the western end of the hamlet called Schmitte, it belongs to the family of Roland and Emma Knittel. During the time of the

Salt Road, three crosses stood here which were called „the three hagglers“ in the local vernacular.

*These all belong to the Zöblen parish:*

### **Kreuzkapelle (Cross Chapel) „Eisr Hear im Ölend“ ("Our Sorrowful Lord") in Zöblen**

Barrel-vaulted room with round apse, a crucifixion grouping on the altar (end of 17. c.) and statues of Rochus and John.

### **Lourdes Chapel in Katzensteig**

Built in 1891/92, with fresco by Hans Buchgschwenter, 1955.



*These all belong to the Schattwald parish:*

### **Kreuzigungskapelle (Crucifixion Chapel) in Vilsrain**

Pointed barrel-vaulted room with a round apse and bell riders. On the neo-Gothic altar there is a crucifixion scene, depiction of the entombment of Christ and angels.

### **Kreuzkapelle (Cross Chapel) in Rehbach**

It was built in 1838 and contains a valuable crucifix.

## **Dairy**

### **Dairy Biedermann**

This cheese dairy is laid out in modern style. Situated in Haldensee (crossing Grän – Tannheim – Reutte) you see cheese being made in the traditional way, but with modern equipment. Please note that tours are NOT POSSIBLE for reasons of hygiene.

Felixe Minas Haus, located in the center of the village, is one of the most valuable cultural heritage buildings in Tannheim and the region. It was built at the end of the 17th century, is a typical farm house for the area, and is a preserved historic landmark. In Felixe Minas Haus there are authentic „Stuben“ (parlours) with original wood paneling and old tiled and masonry stoves. ## Forts and Castles

### Ruins of fort Ehrenberg Reutte

This outpost fort was built by Count Meinhard II, the founder of Tirol and was extended to become the furthest outpost castle in Tirol.

### Ruins of fort Eisenberg and Hohenfreyberg Zell

These date back to the fourteenth century and are the largest castle ruins in the Allgäu. Both castles were destroyed in 1646. The castle museum is in Zell.

### Neuschwanstein Castle

Neuschwanstein was opened to the public in 1886, seven weeks after the death of King Ludwig II. The shy and retiring king had built Neuschwanstein to retire from the public eye. His refuge is now a magnet for the public.

### Hohenschwangau Castle

Built in the twelfth century by the nobles of Schwangau as castle Schwanstein. Having been partially destroyed in the Napoleonic wars, Hohenschwangau was rebuilt in neo-gothic style under crown prince Maximilian of Bavaria by Dominico Quaglio.

### Linderhof Palace

In 1868 Ludwig II was already making his first plans for Linderhof. However, neither the palace modelled on Versailles that was to be sited on the floor of the valley nor the large Byzantine palace envisaged by Ludwig II were ever built. Instead, the new building developed around the forester's house belonging to his father Maximilian II, which was located in the open space in front of the present palace and was used by the king when crown prince on hunting expeditions with his father. Linderhof Palace, the eventual result of a long period of building and rebuilding, is the only large palace King Ludwig II lived to see completed.


