Holiday Fun All Year Round

With its magnificent mountain scenery and beautiful natural surroundings, the Tannheimer Tal is an inviting holiday destination at any time of year. Hiking, cycling, climbing, skiing, tobogganing, snowshoeing and ski touring are among the most popular activities offered by the mountains. However, there is also plenty to experience in and around the valley away from the mountains. Below, you will find the most popular attractions and destinations in the Tannheimer Tal and the surrounding area. Whether you are interested in culture, children's playgrounds, sights or sporting activities, we show you how to make the most of your holiday—and how even rainy days can become memorable experiences.

9er Experience Trail

From the Neunerköpfe mountain station at an altitude of 1,756 metres, a 2.2-kilometre themed trail leads through the mountain landscape. Along the route, eleven stations provide information about nature, animals and the alpine environment, making it an enjoyable experience in all weather conditions. A detour to the 1,862-metre summit is well worthwhile. The largest summit book in the Alps awaits at the top.

KUHFriseur Hiking Exhibition

Art photographer Katharina Ziegler was fascinated by how different cows can look. She photographed cows belonging to farmers from the Tannheimer Tal. The charming cow portraits can be seen along the 9erlebnis-Weg.

Lucky Bench Tour around Neunerköpfe

Specially designed "Glücksbänke" benches invite visitors to pause and relax. Texts incorporated into the benches provide inspiration. The tour is worth visiting in both summer and winter and is also a popular photo spot.

Alpenexpress

The Tannheimer Alpenexpress, a small road train, travels at a leisurely pace from Tannheim to Vilsalpsee (Lake). In spring, the unique alpine flora is in bloom; in summer, lush meadows shine in vibrant colours; in autumn, the landscape glows with impressive shades; and in winter, it is transformed into a fairytale setting. The 480-metre-long and 21-metre-high treetop walk at the Walderlebniszentrum Ziegelwies in Füssen offers fascinating insights into the world of trees. The larch-wood structure rests on pillars extending up to 14 metres into the ground. Crossing the border along the walkway connects Bavaria and Tyrol in an impressive way.

Bergwerke (Mines)

Eisenerzstollen Weißenbach

During the period when salt was transported from Hall via the Fernpass to Reutte and through the Tannheimer Tal towards Lindau, horse-drawn carts were ferried from Ehenbichl to Höfen by raft. The raw material required for this was extracted from the iron ore mine at the old Gacht Pass and processed directly on site.

Burgen und Schlösser (Castles and Palaces)

Burgruine Ehrenberg Reutte

Built in 1296, Ehrenberg Castle offers everything expected of a medieval fortress: defensive walls, high towers and a wealth of history. The Gothic castle complex once welcomed emperors and kings, princes and tsars – history was truly made here.

Burgruine Eisenberg und Hohenfreyberg

Together, the ruins form an impressive group of castles visible from afar. Towards the end of the Thirty Years' War, the castles were evacuated and set on fire to prevent them from falling intact into enemy hands. As the Protestant troops changed their route shortly afterwards, however, the destruction of the fortifications proved unnecessary.

Burgruine Falkenstein

The castle served as the seat of the Augsburg bailiffs until 1582. Falkenstein was also burned down towards the end of the Thirty Years' War. In 1883, King Ludwig II acquired the ruins with plans to build a romantic fairytale castle in the style of Neuschwanstein on the site. The castle remained a dream, however, following King Ludwig's death in Lake Starnberg in 1886.

Hohes Schloss und Staatsgalerie Füssen

The Hohes Schloss is one of the most important late-Gothic castle complexes in Swabia. Its towers, illusionistic paintings and magnificent galleries are particularly impressive. Highlights include the branch gallery of the Bavarian State Painting Collections and the Municipal Gallery.

Schloss Neuschwanstein

Neuschwanstein Castle was opened to the public in 1886, just seven weeks after the death of King Ludwig II. The reclusive king had built the castle as a retreat from public life. Today, his private refuge has become one of the region's most popular attractions.

Sonnenpanoramahut

From the Füssener Jöchle mountain station, the GEO Trail leads to the Sonnenpanoramahut at 1,850 metres in around 15 minutes. It is the largest rotating hiking hat in the Alps. The solid oak structure measures 3.70 metres in diameter and 2.90 metres in height and can be rotated like a carousel. This provides unique panoramic views across the Tannheimer Tal and the Allgäu region.

Panoramainformator (Panoramic Information Display)

Zugspitze, Ortler and Piz Buin – famous mountains that can all be seen from the Tannheimer Tal thanks to the panoramic information display. Located beside the summit cross on the 1,890-metre-high Gamskopf near Grän, it offers views of more than 100 kilometres across the surrounding mountain landscape in good weather. The trail to the oversized telescope is classified as an easy hike and is also suitable for children and older visitors. From the mountain station of the Füssener Jöchle gondola, the summit of the Gamskopf can be reached in around 20 minutes.

GEO-Pfad (GEO Trail)

The Pfronten–Vils–Grän GEO Trail was created to bring the geological history of the mountains to life. The section in Grän follows the theme “Rocks Shape Mountains” and provides fascinating insights into geology. The trail starts at the Füssener Jöchle mountain station and offers impressive views across the Tannheimer Tal and Allgäu along the way. Highline 179

Located close to the Klause at Burgenwelt Ehrenberg, this bridge is one of the region’s most impressive attractions. At 403 metres long, it is one of the world’s longest Tibet-style suspension bridges. The bridge is open to pedestrians all year round.

Jakobsweg (Way of St James)

Pilgrims on the Way of St James can look forward to a particularly impressive route through this region. Much of the trail leads through peaceful rural mountain areas where, for centuries, people's lives were strongly shaped by faith and respect for the forces of nature.

An information brochure including a pilgrim stamp pass is available free of charge from all local tourist information offices.

Kapellen (Chapels)

Zur Pfarre Tannheim gehören (Tannheim Parish)

Mariahilf-Kapelle

The chapel was built following the outbreak of the “Black Death”, which struck Tannheim in 1635. It was constructed in 1649, although the chapel and its high altar were not consecrated until 1685. The building, with its shingle-covered onion dome, has a spacious interior and a harmonious altar ensemble dating from around 1680. The central niche of the shrine-like high altar contains a statue of the Virgin Mary with the Christ Child.

St. Martin in Innergschwend

The original Gothic building, first documented in 1494, was remodelled in the Baroque style in 1685/86. The chapel was consecrated in October 1725 by the then auxiliary bishop of Augsburg. The Rococo cartouche above the chancel arch, dating from around 1760, is decorated with the attributes of St Martin.

St. Sebastian in Berg

In the Tannheim district of Berg, north of Tannheim, stands the outwardly rather modest Baroque St Sebastian Chapel. Its interior, however, surprises visitors with magnificent stucco decoration. Built around 1653, the chapel was enlarged and redesigned in 1757 and most recently renovated in 1995 and 2018.

St. Leonhard in Kienzen (Pestkapelle) (Plague Chapel)

In 1635, soldiers brought the plague into the Tannheimer Tal. At least two-thirds of the population fell victim to the epidemic. The late-Gothic chapel, built between 1488 and 1495, stands in open countryside between the hamlets of Kienzen and Untergschwend.

Lourdeskapelle in der Grotte (Lourdes Chapel in the Grotto)

South of Tannheim, on a wooded hill, lies the idyllic Lourdes Chapel with a replica of the Lourdes grotto and a statue of the Virgin Mary above a bubbling spring. A Way of the Cross with fourteen stations leads to the chapel. It was built in the Neo-Gothic style in 1902 and decorated by school inspector Anton Peterlunger with images inspired by the Litany of Loreto.

Dreifaltigkeitskapelle in Kienzerle (Holy Trinity Chapel)

The chapel, built between 1680 and 1700, dates back to a vow made by two women who survived the plague. It features a flat-ceilinged prayer room with a rounded apse and a small roof turret. The altar painting depicting the Coronation of the Virgin dates from the early 19th century. The chapel was renovated in 1989.

St. Michael in Kienzen

The small St Michael Chapel at the entrance to Kienzen contains a small altar dating from around 1680 with a statue of St Michael and a depiction of God the Father above.

Herz-Jesu-Bildstock am Berg (Sacred Heart Wayside Shrine)

To mark the 200th anniversary of the Sacred Heart vow, Bernadette Müller had a wayside shrine with a Christian statue erected in the meadows of Berg. The inscription reads: “Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us, 1796–1996.”

Zur Pfarre Grän gehören (Grän Parish)

Michaelskapelle in Lumberg

The chapel has been documented since 1695, although it almost certainly existed before then. Its interior features Rococo stucco decoration dating from around 1760. The altar contains a painting of Archangel Michael by Rudolf Rief of Tannheim, created in 1946.

Nepomukkapelle in Grän

The chapel stands on a site where the Log stream repeatedly overflowed into the surrounding fields at a bend near Obbichl. The present chapel was built in 1729.

Kapelle zum hl. Jakob in Haldensee (Chapel of St James in Haldensee)

In Haldensee, the birthplace of master builder Andreas Hafenegger, stands the chapel dedicated to St James the Less. It was first documented around 1695 and may have been built with Hafenegger's involvement.

Zur Pfarre Nesselwängle gehören (Nesselwängle Parish)

Antoniuskapelle

The Antonius Chapel belongs to the “Sunneschlössli” and was built by Fritz Rigoni and Georg Schatz. It was consecrated in 1997.

Dreikreuzkapelle in der Schmitte (Three Crosses Chapel)

Located at the western end of the village in the district of Schmitte, the chapel is privately owned by the Roland and Emma Knittel family. During the time of the historic salt transport route, three crosses stood here and were popularly known as “bei den drei Schächern” – “by the three thieves”.

Dreifaltigkeitskapelle in Rauth (Holy Trinity Chapel)

Built by local landowners in 1726. The rectangular prayer room has a three-sided choir end and decorative stucco work on the chancel arch.

Maria-Hilf-Kapelle bei Rauth

Situated at the road junction leading to Rauth, the chapel was rebuilt by Josef Bilgeri after the war. The prayer room has a small bell turret. Its painting of the Virgin Mary with the Christ Child was created by Melchior Paul von Deschwanden in 1874.

Kapelle zum Hl. Johannes Baptist in Haller (Chapel of St John the Baptist in Haller)

Built in 1736/37. The high altar was donated by the residents of Haller in 1641. The chapel contains a painting of the Virgin Mary with the Christ Child, St John of Nepomuk and St John the Baptist by Toni Kirchmayr of Innsbruck, dating from 1958. Other works include a statue of St Sebastian from 1640, originating from the former early-Baroque altar, a Pietà by Anton Santifaller of Merano and a painting from 1780 depicting the Holy Family with St John the Baptist and St Apollonia.

Maria-Heimsuchungskapelle in Gaicht (Chapel of the Visitation in Gaicht)

This chapel with a pitched roof and boarded pointed bell turret containing two bells was built by local residents in 1695 on the site of an earlier Gothic chapel. The interior features a lunette vault and simple decorative stucco dating from around 1730. The chapel underwent extensive renovation in 1959.

Regenbogenkapelle in Rauth

This small single-bay chapel with a pitched roof and three-sided choir stands directly beside the path before the hamlet of Rauth and is privately owned by the Perle family. The barrel-vaulted interior contains a particularly fine Baroque crucifix.

Zur Pfarre Zöblen gehören (Zöblen Parish)

Rochuskapelle auf der Oberhalde

The Kreuzkapelle "Eisr Hear im Ölend" contains a Crucifixion group and a statue of St Roch dating from around 1680. A statue of St John dates from the beginning of the 19th century.

Lourdeskapelle in Katzensteig

Built in 1900 and decorated with a fresco by Hans Buchgschwentner. The chapel also serves as the mortuary chapel for the parish of Zöblen.

Zur Pfarre Schattwald gehören (Schattwald Parish)

Kreuzigungskapelle in Vilsrain (Crucifixion Chapel)

The interior, with its rounded apse, features a pointed barrel vault. The Neo-Gothic altar contains a Crucifixion group and a figure of Christ in the tomb accompanied by an angel. The antependium is decorated with a relief depicting the Adoration of the Magi. The figures of St Wendelin and St Isidore date from the mid-18th century.

Kreuzkapelle in Rehbach

This chapel is privately owned by the Barbist family and was built in 1838. Tradition holds that a pilgrimage to Rehbach may bring relief to people suffering from headaches if they pray for God's blessing in the chapel. The midday bell is rung every day – a duty traditionally carried out by the owner of the house.

Zur Pfarre Jungholz gehören (Jungholz Parish)

Peter und Paul Kapelle in Langenschwand (St Peter and St Paul Chapel)

The chapel was built in the mid-18th century and remodelled in 1902. Its four-column altar, featuring a painting of Saints Peter and Paul, dates from around 1700.

Antonius Kapelle Gießenschwand

The chapel, with its pitched roof and small bell turret, was built around 1750.

Kirchen (Churches)

Pfarrkirche hl. Nikolaus in Tannheim (Parish Church of St Nicholas in Tannheim)

The parish church of Tannheim, the religious centre of the Tannheimer Tal, is the second-largest rural church in the Diocese of Innsbruck after Neustift. It was built in the Baroque style between 1722 and 1724 by Andreas Hafenegger from Haldensee. Renovations took place from 1989 to 1996, and the organ was renewed in 1998. The exterior is characterised by the imposing nave, the recessed presbytery with rounded end and the semicircular extension housing the sacristy and side chapel. Its historic set of bells, cast by the Löffler family, is the only complete set of its kind preserved in Tyrol.

Pfarrkirche Mariä Himmelfahrt in Nesselwängle (Parish Church of the Assumption in Nesselwängle)

The first late-Gothic church, which stood above the village on the "Lähn", was destroyed by an avalanche in the early 18th century. Its successor was built on the present site between 1728 and 1732, but was severely damaged by a major fire in 1882. After reconstruction, it was consecrated again in 1885. At the end of the 19th century, the tower with its chamfered upper corners received its distinctive roof. The most recent church renovation was completed in 1992.

Pfarrkirche hl. Wendelin in Grän (Parish Church of St Wendelin in Grän)

In the centre of Grän stands the church dedicated to St Wendelin, with its distinctive onion-domed tower. Grän became an outlying parish of Tannheim in 1794 and an independent parish in 1980. A chapel dedicated to St Wendelin, patron saint of livestock, probably existed here as early as the 15th century and was replaced by a new building in 1617. The present church dates from 1789, was built under Michael Zobl and consecrated in 1793. The interior is characterised by a hall-like nave with Doric pilasters and Classical features. Renovations took place between 1986 and 1992.

Expositurkirche hl. Josef in Zöblen (Church of St Joseph in Zöblen)

Zöblen has been an outlying parish since 1794 and is still administered from Schattwald. The church was built in 1785 on the site of a chapel dating from 1682 and was consecrated in 1793. After a fire in 1932, the church was restored. Its most recent renovation took place in 1989. The interior consists of a hall-like nave with rounded corners at the chancel arch wall and a barrel vault with lunettes above a continuous cornice. To the east is a recessed choir with rounded end, while the west side features a double gallery.

Pfarrkirche hl. Wolfgang in Schattwald (Parish Church of St Wolfgang in Schattwald)

From 1506 onwards, Schattwald was served pastorally from Nesselwängle. It became a chaplaincy in 1699, an outlying parish in 1787 and an independent parish in 1948. A 16th-century chapel was enlarged in the 17th century. The nave was raised in 1756, the tower rebuilt in 1835 and the present church constructed in 1893. A vestibule leads into the six-bay nave with a barrel vault with lunettes

resting on half-columns above a continuous cornice. Beyond the triumphal arch is a short choir ending in a three-sided apse.

Pfarrkirche Mariä Namen in Jungholz (Parish Church of the Holy Name of Mary in Jungholz)

The church replaced a chapel dating from 1714 and was built in 1739. It was enlarged in 1743, and the tower with its pointed spire was added in 1827/28. The ceiling frescoes by Franz Anton Weiß from 1781 depict the Virgin Mary with the Christ Child and the four continents in the choir, while the nave shows the Madonna distributing grace. The pulpit and Stations of the Cross reliefs, dating from around 1860, were created by Franz Schweigkart. The organ, with ten stops, was built by Fridolin Behler in 1871. A comprehensive renovation was carried out in 1974.
